

Other trips included the Grade 3 and 4 visit to the Lion Park and the grade 6 visit to the South African Airways Aviation Museum. These visits are much more than simply trips for the sake of going somewhere. These field trips are designed to inspire our learners to dream big and to broaden their horizons.









CityKidz also believes in improving upon the leadership qualities of its learners.
