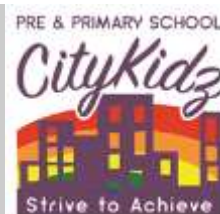

Teacher's workshop

On Monday morning our CityKidz staff were treated to an engaging workshop presented by Ma'am Thembi and Ma'am Cindy, our Foundation Phase HODs. The workshop theme was "Be Kind!" in line with our CityKidz theme for 2024. The big idea is to intentionally practise kindness and also inspire and encourage kindness amongst our learners. In the spirit of "it takes a village to raise a child" we were reminded that the role players collaborating in moulding responsible learners are our staff (admin, maintenance and teachers), our parents and the learners themselves. On a practical level, ideas for promoting kindness in the classroom were suggested, for example, kindness jars and kindness calendars.

We were also privileged to have author and parent Mrs Thandile Ntumba speak to us about her autobiographical book "The Monster That Signed My Psychiatric File On My Behalf". Thandile spoke candidly around many issues which may touch the lives of our youth, including emotional wounding and compromised mental health. She encouraged our staff and spoke of ways in which we may be more aware and helpful to learners who may be living through traumatising situations.

PICK-UP ZONE

Learners are given a 15-minute grace period at the end of the school day to wait for taxis and lifts home at the Pick-Up Zone.

Any child still at the Pick-Up Zone after 14:15 will be taken to the Kidz Zone Aftercare.

A Fee of R50.00 will be payable. You will be invoiced for this at the end of the month by the Kidz Zone Aftercare Supervisors. If your child stays later than 15:00 you will be liable for a R100 fine if they are not registered at the Kidz Zone Aftercare.

PLEASE NOTE: 'Extra-mural' literally means 'beyond the walls'. Extra-murals are key to a balanced curriculum, healthy lifestyles, and an enhanced school experience. School times have been changed to INTEGRATE a structured programme whereby the entire grade will be involved in some cultural club, music or sporting activity.



The integrated programme during school time aims to revitalise the school -day and curriculum as well.

The purpose of the programme is to expand learning and recreational opportunities, provide our children with holistic support and expanded opportunities. See timetable.

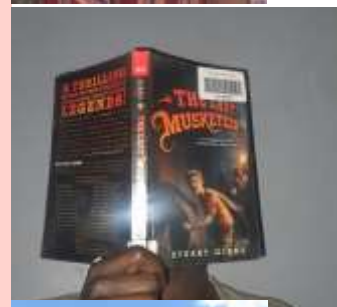

School Times

School gates officially open at 07:00 each day.

All learners must be inside the gates by 7:35 each school day. The school day commences promptly at 07:45 for all learners.

At 07:45 line up and registration takes place.

07h15 - Support classes are conducted. Children will receive letters and a timetable. Children identified must attend. Support is from 07h15-07:45. Support is regarded as consolidation.

Late-comers will be issued with Behaviour Debts/Demerits. Please note this will be closely monitored. All Latecomers will sit in the pick-up zone until the second period starts as they will not be allowed into class and disrupt others.

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

Grade RR learners finish class at 12:30 each day. ONLY IF a child has a sibling in a higher grade they will be allowed to stay in class until 14:00 until the entire Foundation Phase is released. On Fridays they will be allowed to stay in class until 13:00.

Grade R - 1 learners finish class at 13:30 each day.

Grades 2 – 7 learners finish class at 14:00 each day.

Please note: Grade R-7 learners finish class at 13:00 on Fridays.

Please take note of the following:

The bell rings at 07:45 and all learners will assemble at their designated points.

Important notices will be made at morning line-up.

All periods are 30 minutes long. Most subjects have been allocated double teaching periods (60 min) to obtain maximum teaching time and to allow sufficient time for tasks to be completed during the allocated period. This format limits movement from class to class.

The extended times for the Grade 2 and 3's in the Foundation Phase was standardised to accommodate additional teaching time (focus on Maths and English) and to limit disruptions in that phase.

On the last day of each term the school closes at 11:00 for all learners.

The first ten minutes of the day in the InterSen Phase is used for administrative work, e.g., checking registers, homework books, newsletters and collecting reply slips.

International Day of Holocaust Remembrance

International Holocaust Remembrance Day is commemorated worldwide on 27 January in memory of the victims of the Holocaust. This date was chosen because it marks the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi concentration and death camp, by Soviet forces in 1945. It commemorates the genocide (killing) that resulted in the death of an estimated 6 million Jews. Between 1939 and 1945, the Nazis murdered 1.2 million Jewish children as part of the "Final Solution." Although children were not specifically targeted because of their age, they did occupy a unique place in the Nazi mind. Children represented the future potential of the Jewish race. For the Nazis, this meant that killing or sterilizing children was all the more crucial in order to completely eradicate world Jewry. Children under the age of 15 or 16 had little hope of surviving



in Nazi occupied territories. Too young and too weak to perform hard physical labour, they were usually sent directly to the death camps. Amazingly, some Jewish children managed to survive by living in hiding, or escaping Germany before the genocide began. *Read the Diary of Anne Frank. Anne Frank was one of over one million Jewish children who died in the Holocaust.*

Holocaust Memorial Day serves as a stark reminder of the horrors of the past and emphasizes the importance of preventing such atrocities in the future.
