Finally, on the itinerary was the school tour, led by the Head of Departments. The highlight of the day was the recently revamped support room, newly painted prefab classrooms and renovated toilets. The Siyabonga songbirds thanked the delegation for visiting CityKidz through their cheery, thankful song.

It was truly an awesome experience and CityKidz's 'flag was flown high and



"Afrikaans is lekker!" at CityKidz"

Die beste onderwysers onderrig uit die hart uit, nie uit boeke nie." – author unknown. The best teachers teach from the heart, not from books.

What makes the Afrikaans in the Foundation phase so 'lekker?' Could it be the songs, rhymes, poems or dances perhaps?

Maybe it is the stories, flashcards or interactive games on the smartboard? Perhaps it is the flamboyant teaching style?

I do believe it is a combination of all those things mentioned. When I first met with ma'am Reynolds and ma'am Vorster, we all agreed that the Afrikaans programme in the foundation phase has to be fun and interactive. It should bring the language to life for the learners.

In my short time thus far at CityKidz it has been such a joy to teach the learners my home language. They have all been so eager to learn and in passing I always hear: "Ma'am, are we having Afrikaans today?"

My goal for the learners is to have a good understanding of the language when they transition from Foundation to Intersen phase.

A basic layout of an hour lesson for example includes the following:

- We spend a few minutes on warming up the Afrikaans center may it be our various songs the learners so love to sing:
- "Goeie môre", "So ry die trein", "Ek ry met my rooi motorkar", "Hasie, hoekom is jou stert so kort", "Oom Olifant" and many, many more. If you haven't heard these songs already, ask your child to sing to you.
- or it may be some flashcards with the alphabet and their sounds in Afrikaans; or it may be a story that is read from a big book such as: "Skop, Vusi, skop!" and that I translate for better understanding.
- Thereafter, we jump into the "Vraag van die dag" which depends on the topic of our discussion. We write down some vocabulary and translate these and then build sentences together, broadening the vocabulary further.
- And I end off the lesson with a recap of the work or a game. The Grade 3 B learners enjoy hangman on the blackboard. They have worked their way up from me leading the game and choosing Afrikaans words to them each getting a turn and bringing an Afrikaans word to the board. This helps to strengthen their vocabulary.

"Activities are not limited to only writing in our workbooks. We look at Afrikaans PowerPoint presentations that I prepare on the smartboard or videos from different sources. Two videos that all my learners enjoy are: "Lami, vissiekleure" and "Vokale." Both found on YouTube. One of our recent presentations was looking at the different parts of an elephant as their favourite song, Oom Olifant, talks about a tail in the back and a tail in the front. Afrikaans is very much alive and kicking still and it warms my teacher heart to see the learners so enthused when I enter the class. 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Intervention/Support Class- Shirley Slabbert

CityKidz continually strives to provide a dynamic child friendly environment; creating opportunities for every child to feel valued and supported and where they can experience personal success.

In addition to the class teacher continuing to spend time teaching the prescribed Grade Level Skills , some children need additional support, in smaller classes.

During the holidays, the existing Support Room, has received a major upgrade. It has been transformed into a bright inviting space, guaranteed to encourage inquisitive little learners, first the opportunity to explore, and then to claim as their own, this extra special, secure happy place.

A closely monitored, developmental Phonic and Reading Programme "Letterland * has been purchased. This programme will reinforce, in particular, Language skills taught in class, through fun interactive activities e.g. songs, stories, art and movement.

All activities are geared towards developing a child's spoken and written vocabulary, phonics, spelling, reading and comprehension abilities.

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Maintenance Upgrades Continued


Helping to shape, develop, and educate children's minds happens not only inside a classroom but also within the school environment. Making sure that the environment where teachers help children grow is well taken care of is part and parcel of our children's development. Our dedicated maintenance and admin staff worked throughout the holidays ensuring that every area is well maintained. Properly maintaining the school grounds is a year-round job. This holiday was no exception. Below are areas that received upgrades, additions, repairs, or replacements.

Painting outside some prefabs, fixing the backsplash in both senior bathrooms, painting junior bathrooms, collecting resources which were donated by Jenni Lewkowski (trampoline, balance beam bar, toys, games, files, washing machine and books) and then sorting, allocating to FP classes or support class. Decorating and upgrading the support room with our new treasures and where our FP Afrikaans teacher sits during her admin times was another exciting initiative. Installing palisade bars under the Sandton steps. The Grade 5A classroom underwent a restoration and upgrade; old floorboards were removed, floor then filled, cemented, tiled and walls painted. Black chalk boards were repainted in several classes. Unpacking and redecorating all classes under the hall. Providing ALL Grade 1 classes with new wooden desktops - the base is the original frame, but desks look brand new. Installing a security gate at the security room. Touching up and filling up ground with cement outside classes under the hall's entrance. In addition, plastering walls and painting outside classes and fixing the steps. Providing "new" teacher's desks (kindly donated by Wayne Plit) for four teachers. The arrival of upgraded printers was welcomed. Fixing a leaking roof with eco rubber and securing our flag poles. All the above improvements help to create a wonderful, inspiring environment. However, this will only have a long-term benefit if they can be sustained and maintained by all of us.




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Magnificent Mooi Street Mural




Pets: Why They're Good for Us
