#### Building 3D Shapes that don't melt in your mouth

As we are nearing the end of the school year, we are ready for our holidays, but this doesn't mean that learning has stopped! The Grade 2 classes have been learning about new, different, and at times ... challenging topics. One topic that children have had loads of fun learning about and experimenting with are 3-Dimensional shapes. Although 3D shapes are not abstract, as they are all around us, it can be difficult to imagine and grasp their properties while drawing them in workbooks. For this reason, the teachers decided to take on a more "hands on" approach and use jelly tots and toothpicks to build 3D shapes.

The learners were tasked with creating 2 different 3D shapes of their choice. The only catch was that these shapes had to be accurate! That means the correct number of faces, corners, and other properties. The learners thoroughly enjoyed crafting and creating their shapes, while still making sure that they were precise. Encouraging learners to build their own shapes, make mistakes and ask for help is all part of the fun-learning process!

After a successful day of learning a few jelly tots were "missing" by the end of it.
