**School Closing Time:** School closes at **1h30** for the **Foundation Phase.** 


School closes at **02h15** for the **Intersen Phase**.

#### PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADES 1-3

Level 4 in Home Language (English) OR Level 3 in Mathematics

**PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADES 4 – 6** Please note the promotion requirements for Grade 4 – 6 learners:

Learners must pass all 3 of these subjects with percentage criteria specified:

Home Language (English) 50% or more

First Additional Language (Afrikaans) 40% or more

Mathematics 40% or more

Learners must meet the following percentage criteria for other subjects: 40% or more in any 2 remaining subjects: Social Sciences; Life Skills; Natural Sciences and Technology.

Should a learner fall short on any of the above percentage criteria for the specified subjects, they will not be promoted.

PROMOTION REQUIREMENTS FOR GRADE 7 Please note the promotion requirements for Grade 7 learners:

Learners must pass all 3 of these subjects with percentage criteria specified:

Home Language (English) 50% or more

First Additional Language (Afrikaans) 40% or more

Mathematics 40% or more

Learners must meet the following percentage criteria for other subjects: 40% or more in 3 subjects 30% or more in 2 subjects Other subjects include: Social Sciences Life Orientation Technology Natural Sciences EMS Creative Arts

Should a learner not achieve on any of the above percentage criteria for the specified subjects, they will not be promoted.

**GRADES 4 – 7 ASSESSMENT PLANS TERM 1** Grades 4 – 7 Assessment Plans have been sent home for this Term.

These plans are subject to change without prior notice but should provide a good guideline to assist parents to see how and when their child/ren will be assessed.

#### HOW PROMOTION MARKS ARE CALCULATED AT THE END OF THE YEAR.

Grade 4 - 6 SBA Mark (School Bases Assessment) (Term 1-3) 75% + Term 4 Exam Mark 25% = Year End Promotion Mark Grade 7 SBA Mark (School Bases Assessment) (Term 1-3) 40% + Term 4 Exam Mark 60% = Year End Promotion Mark



### **GRADE R COUNTING**

Object counting. We need to encourage young children to touch the objects as they count them. Physical knowledge is derived through touching; using; playing with; and acting on concrete/physical material. Children need a lot of concrete experiences in classroom to develop their physical knowledge of numeracy. It is through counting physical objects that children: Experience that two objects are different to three objects; When children learn to accurately count objects they gain greater understanding of the all important one-to-one concept, which posits that each number represents one (more) object.

The first thing that children need to learn is the names of the numbers and the sequence in which they come

(i.e. social knowledge).

Saying the number sequence after the teacher (necessary until the children can do so by themselves): The teacher first counts out the sequence (one, two, three, ... up to 5 and then 10 and then 15 and 20 and so on) The children repeat the sequence after the teacher first in the small group sitting on the carpet and then as individuals within this group.


