Bread and butter issues

Labelling School Items : All clothing and school items must be clearly marked with a permanent marker.

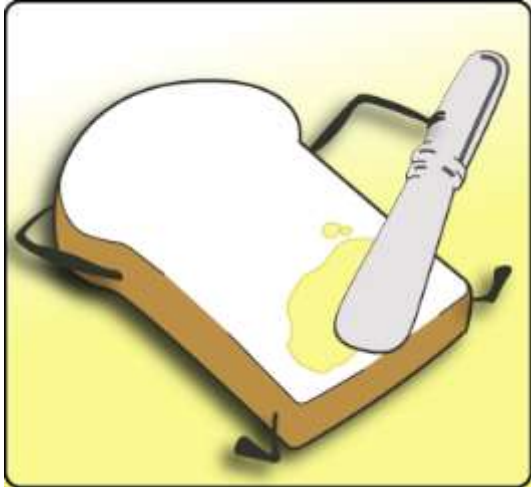
Parking: Parents are requested to please not park at the entrance and exit gates in front of the school. Please teach your child at an early age to cross at the zebra crossing or a traffic light and not jay walk.

Healthy Eating: Please be reminded of the importance of healthy eating. Lunch boxes should consist of a brown bread sandwich, fruit or yogurt and a non-fizzy juice. Children should drink plenty of water especially in the heat. Eating a healthy breakfast will give your child a good start and help them to concentrate.

School Attendance: Although learners were asked to refrain from being absent, as continuous assessment is being completed, please do not send your child to school when he / she is not well or has any type of infection.

Safety: Children walking home must walk in groups if they are not accompanied by an adult. Children must not talk to strangers. Parents must be reminded that once off the school premises; safety is the **parent's responsibility**.

Medication: No medication will be administered to children unless there is written permission from the parent.



AFTER CARE: The official hours of aftercare are strictly from 14h00 to 17h00 thereafter the children are left unsupervised, the gates are locked and the staff go home. You must collect your child before 17h30.
