No matter how small your action, **Mandela Day** is about changing the world for the better.



Tomorrow is Youth day- June 16th

On the morning of June 16, 1976, thousands of students from the African township of Soweto, outside Johannesburg, gathered at their schools to participate in a student-organized protest demonstration. The crowd swelled to more than 10,000 students. En route to the stadium, approximately fifty policemen stopped the students and tried to turn them back.

At first, the security forces tried unsuccessfully to disperse the students with tear gas and warning shots. Then policemen fired directly into the crowd of demonstrators.

Many students responded by running for shelter, while others retaliated by pelting the police with stones. That day, two students, Hastings Ndlovu and Hector Pieterse, died from police gunfire; hundreds more sustained injuries during the subsequent chaos that engulfed Soweto.

Many people visit the Hector Pieterse memorial and museum in Orlando West, Soweto, to remember the young man whose sacrifice came to symbolise the injustice of apartheid to so many.

Music and dance festivals have also become a traditional way of celebrating the vibrant energy of youth.

The shootings in Soweto sparked a massive uprising that soon spread to more urban and rural areas.
