Dress: Civvies- NO CHARGE. Bring Costumes and towels- There will be a Slip



Motivation is a key factor in learners' success at every stage of their education, and both parents and teachers play a pivotal role in providing and encouraging it. Of course, that is much easier said than done, as all learners are motivated differently, and it takes time and a lot of effort to learn to get a class-room full of learners enthusiastic about learning, working hard, and pushing themselves to excel. For that reason, providing motivation is a skill that all parents and teachers must develop. The young child in reception year (Grade R or RR) depends mainly upon praise, encouragement and motivation.
