Take the 3rd left onto End Street400m

Continue onto Joe Slovo Drive- 89 m Turn right onto Albertina Sisulu Rd-1.7 km Turn left onto Fuller Street- 270 m

Turn left onto Thames Rd.

Destination will be on the right-180 m- Johannesburg Cricket Club corner of 47 Bertrams and Thames Road. Directly opposite Ellis Park.

Chinese families gather together for a reunion dinner on New Year's Eve and clean their houses to sweep away bad fortune on New Year's Day.




CityKidz is calling on all learners in the Foundation Phase to help us celebrate one of the most important literacy days on the calendar.
